COMPULSORY HI-VIS RIDER CLOTHING




This article is not BMWMCCACT policy or the collective view of your committee and members are encouraged to research the topic for themselves.



This year the Committee has adopted a different approach where you book, pay and attend a selected rider training program and on completion present your 'certificate' to the Treasurer who will reimburse you \$100 off the course cost. Sorry no reimbursement for travel, accommodation, meals or entertainment: training course only.

The Committee has approved the following training providers and courses. If you find another one, please send the details to the Committee@bmwmccact.org.au for consideration.

In anticipation of the massed enthusiasm, the subsidy is capped at 20 member courses for 2012. We will keep you up to date on where we are at and if you are concerned please email the Treasurer@bmwmccact.org.au before booking your course.

The rules!

- You must be a current financial member of the BMWMCCACT Inc. Yes we will check.
- You must book, pay and attend a course with one of the 3 rider training organisations listed above.
- You, having successfully completed your course send a copy of your certificate to the

<u>Treasurer@bmwmccact.org.au</u> with your contact and bank details who will reimburse you \$100 (maximum).

You can only be reimbursed once in this program cycle, April 2012 to March 2013.

CLUB MEMBER FIRST AID TRAINING

Know all there is to know about cornering, braking and riding safely on road or dirt? Then maybe a first aid course is more to your liking or need; not having done a rider skills course.

The Club has arranged and will subsidise a motorcyclist centric first aid course. This one-day course will not turn you into a paramedic, but may give you the skills to help out at an accident until one turns up. Depending on where you are, this may be quite a wait and worth having some basic first aid skills like:

- Being Prepared
- Mechanism of Injury
- Scene Safety
- > DRABCD action plan & CPR
- Choking

- Wounds & Bleeding
- Head, Neck and Spinal injury
- Chest & Abdominal injury
- Breaks & Dislocations
- Medical Emergencies

The dates of each course will be notified by email, so may sure that you are a financial member and look out for the email. More Rules: Only BMWMCCACT financial members will be accepted and preference given to those who have not completed a previous first aid course.

The cost of the subsidised course is \$40 per member who can live without the certificate and \$50 for those who want to be assessed and if successfully completed awarded a nationally recognised qualification in 'Provide Emergency Life Support' (HLTFA201B).

'Remember the life you save doesn't have to be your own, so make sure you bring a riding buddy.'



Fact Sheet

The NRMA - ACT Road Safety Trust recognises that motorcycle riders are a vulnerable road user group. The Trust supports education and training for motorcyclists and has been a significant contributor to a range of motorcycle safety initiatives since its inception. The Trust's support for GEARS programs is gratefully acknowledged.

What is an Advanced GEARS (Intermediate level) course?

The course is for women only.

The Advanced GEARS course is designed to build on skills obtained in the basic GEARS course. It is offered by Girls on the Move Inc (GOT'M), with the assistance of ACT Stay Upright Motorcycle Techniques, to support women riders in the ACT, and is subsidised by the NRMA-ACT Road Safety Trust. The course is conducted by Stay Upright Motorcycle Techniques ACT and provides an opportunity to:

- Allow for the ongoing review of current female rider training;
- Provide advice on improving the delivery of training for women;
 and
- Develop an intermediate road craft course that will include both theory and on-road training.

GOT'M was founded in 2003 and consists of a group of female motorcycle riders and enthusiasts. It aims to provide a social network for female motorcycle riders and females interested in motorcycles. It also provides an opportunity for the sharing of information to enhance women's knowledge of motorcycling, support new riders, and those returning to two wheels.

If you have been riding for more than 6 months, or have done the basic GEARS course, and are keen to improve your riding practices and road craft techniques at an intermediate level, then come along. The course is for women only and covers:

- Higher speed cornering, braking, counter-steering and manoeuvring techniques
- Participant ride (metro and rural)
- Feedback and review.

We all need to be aware and responsive on the road. The course will give riders the opportunity to enhance and practice their skills at realistic road speeds encountered in everyday riding and maximise your safety on the road.

Cost: \$105 for 6 hours training with the course being subsidised through GOT'M with funding from the NRMA-ACT Road Safety Trust.
