

Want to be part of the Committee and help run the Club? No prior experience is required but enthusiasm is, as is a small commitment of time to attend the various committee meetings. The committee positions and functions include:

- **President**. Holds the formal position representing the Club to members, BMW Clubs Australia, other BMW and motorcycle clubs and community.
- > Vice President. Deputises for the President if away or unable to fulfil his or her duties.
- ➤ **Ride Coordinator.** Coordinates the Club's riding calendar. Members are encouraged to submit their own ideas for rides or lead a ride to their favourite destination. Club rides are posted to the website, included to the magazine and emailed to members.
- > **Secretary**. Responsible for taking and publishing the Committee, AGM and Monthly meeting Minutes; monitors the Club's post office box and responds to correspondence and other matters pertaining to the Club.
- ➤ **Treasurer**. Maintains the Club's financial accounts including membership applications and renewals, advertising and other revenues, whilst paying accounts as required. A financial balance sheet is required at the AGM and submittal to the ACT Registrar's office through the Public Officer.
- **Public Officer**. Is responsible for the maintaining the Club's incorporation with the ACT Office of Regulatory Services. For more information see here: http://www.ors.act.gov.au/community/associations
- ➤ Membership Secretary. Manages the Club memberships register and processes new and renewing membership applications. From 2013 this will be on-line using the Club's new website and software.
- Social Secretary. Responsible for arranging the Club Award & Christmas dinner, alternate year mid-winter Club dinner and weekend with the BMWMCCVIC and infrequent social activities not necessarily motorcycle related.
- **Webmaster**. Looks after the Club's online presence <u>www.bmwmccact.org.au</u> that requires some back of house IT skills or enthusiasm to learn.
- **Editor.** Edits and arranges publishing of *Shaft Drive Lines*, the monthly magazine of the BMWMCCACT. An opportunity to put into practise your hidden or latent journalistic talent.
- ➤ BMW Clubs Australia Delegate. Represents the Club at BMW Clubs Australia that provides a formal link between BMW Australia and the various BMW motorcycle and car clubs in Australia. There is generally one formal meeting per annum in Melbourne.

If standing for a formal position is not for you, yet, then why not volunteer to assist in other regular club activities like the Club's *Kosciuszko Rally*, Club concourse run concurrently with *Shannons German Auto Day* or monthly breakfast and meeting. DAY RIDE-SNOWY MOUNTAINS 3 JANUARY 2013

The Christmas break is almost done, and it seems only right to squeeze in one more longish day ride before starting the 2013 work year. A ride through the Snowy Mountains beckons, and an email out to the Club Ride Coordinator alerts fellow riders, but who knows who is around at this time of the year?

The day dawns cool and cloudy, I fill up the bike in Manuka and adjourn for a dawn coffee at Urban Pantry. I'm surprised at the number of fellow early risers, but I guess there are many other like-minded souls going about their business before the heat of the day arrives. It's pleasantly cool motoring out to Williamsdale. Bob (F650GS) is waiting for me there, so I'm not going to be on my own today. We still have 10 minutes before departure time, so it's sit and watch the highway traffic, as our fellow riders arrive, 5 in total. Ian Hahn on the mighty LT, Hoss on the ever reliable GS1150, EI Presidente Martin Robertson on his GS1200 and Garry and Jane Smee on the R1200ST. An impressive turn out for such a long ride with an early start!

As we motor to Cooma, the cloud burns off, and the sun starts to sting with its heat. We pick up Mark Cooper (RT1200) at Bunyan and continue through Cooma and to the turn off for Adaminaby. The run uphill is sublime, coolish, clear blue sky that seems to go forever and not too much traffic. This is motorcycling happiness and a good warm up for the roads to come. We stop for morning tea at the bakery in

Adaminaby.

From here, we press on to the Kiandra turnoff, this section of the Highway offering up more sweeping corners. At the turnoff, there is a large group of bikes doing the obligatory photos. We regather our modest group and then head off into the National Park to Tumbarumba via the Elliott Way. Not much traffic; combined with the clear sunny day means we have a wonderful ride through one of the most scenic roads in Australia. The mountain air is crisp, with the forests looking in good shape as they recover from old bushfires that have ravaged this area. I stop at a couple of the lookouts to take a moment and soak up the landscape. My favourite section of the road is at the bottom of the valley as the road snakes alongside the river, not pushing too hard, rather enjoying the echo of the exhaust note off the rocks and letting the bike flow through the corners. At the end of the valley, the road climbs dramatically up to the escarpment. Near the top, I pass Garry and Jane, giving them a wave as I motor past. It's an easy run through the forest to the next turn off, where I join the rest of the group as we wait to regroup. From here, the road into Tumbarumba always feels like such an anticlimax after the Elliott Way, but really any road would have such a hard act to match up to the Elliott Way.

It's straight to the servo in Tumbarumba and then round to the 4 Bears Café for an early lunch. Late morning and its much hotter than my last visit here, like 27 degrees now versus -1 in mid-winter. Lunch is idled away in the shade with cool drinks and largish meals; I guess this is what the rich people do and beats working for a living! We decide to press onto into Victoria via Jingellic.

The run down to Jingellic is good, hot, with some minor roadworks along the way that splits our group into two. At Jingellic, Coops and I wait in the shade for the others to re-join us. Once the others have arrived, we motor on into Victoria, crossing the Murray River that is still flowing and looking damn inviting in the afternoon heat. Turning North to Walwa, the countryside is baking and there is absolutely no respite from the sun as the road undulates through the farming valleys. At Tintaldra, we cross back into New South Wales, on to Khancoban where we cool off with ice creams and water, resting in the shade of the large oak trees opposite the servo. This gives us the opportunity to observe the rest of the world passing by, and there are plenty of other motorcyclists out riding too, despite the heat.

Rest over; we head out along the Alpine Way, grateful to be riding in some shade at last. There's plenty of traffic about, so as usual caution is required with the oncoming traffic. The views out from Scammel Spur are superb with the Victorian High Country looking so close in the clear mountain air. As we climb up to Dead Horse gap from Tom Groggin, the temperature finally starts to drop, although the mid corner wet tar patch would say otherwise. The GS steps out on the rear end as I attempt to glide over this wet sticky mass of goo, but regathers itself and we continue on, safely to the top.

At Dead Horse Gap, it's a very cool 28 degrees as we regather as a group and enjoy the views and the cooler air. Moments later we are joined by a very well loved and used K100 carrying a large German and his kit. The bike is a \$300 special purchased in Perth and is transporting said rider around our sunburnt country. He's having a ball and loving the bike! Who says you need the latest piece of kit to enjoy riding! His riding companion whose steed is a hybrid R60 with 800 barrels and 1000 side covers soon joins us.

Confused? See the photos for a better explanation.

We leave these intrepid adventurers at Dead Horse and motor on down the hill to Jindabyne to fuel up bikes and riders. Ice creams and cold drinks all round. There are plenty of other motorcycle groups doing the same thing so the servo is busy.

From Jindabyne, Garry and Jane (who have family commitments) press on directly to Canberra via Berridale with Ian, while the rest of us with more time on our hands head east on the Barry Way, then North to Dalgety, and finally northwest back to Cooma via the deserted farm roads. This route is open and flowing with good corners, the surface is sealed but lumpy and is well worth doing if you have the time. The views of the surrounding countryside are great and it's so much more interesting than the main highway back through Jindabyne. At Cooma we farewell Mark Cooper and for the rest of us it's the home run into Canberra. It's very hot in the late afternoon sun and there's no respite on the Monaro Highway. I pull into the garage just after 6:00pm, with just over 700kms showing on the clock for the day. Not bad for a day ride into the mountains in the middle of summer.

With the bike away in the garage its straight into the shower to cool off, followed by a cool beer.



You can only be reimbursed once in this program cycle, April 2012 to March 2013.

CLUB MEMBER FIRST AID TRAINING

Know all there is to know about cornering, braking and riding safely on road or dirt? Then maybe a first aid course is more to your liking or need; not having done a rider skills course.

The Club has arranged and will subsidise a motorcyclist centric first aid course. This one-day course will not turn you into a paramedic, but may give you the skills to help at an accident until one turns up. Depending on where you are, this may be quite a wait and worth having some basic first aid skills like:

- Being Prepared
- Mechanism of Injury
- Scene Safety
- DRABCD action plan & CPR
- Choking

Wounds & Bleeding

- Head, Neck and Spinal injury
- Chest & Abdominalinjury
- Breaks & Distocations
- > Medical Emergencies


The dates of each course will be notified by email, so may sure that you are a financial member and look out for the email. More Rules: Only BMW/MCOACT financial members will be accepted and preference given to those who have not completed a previous first aid course.

The cost of the subsidised course is \$30 per member who can live without the certificate and \$50 for those who want to be assessed and if successfully completed awarded a nationally recognised qualification in 'Provide Emergency Life Support' (HLTFA201B).

'Remember the life you save doesn't have to be your own, so make sure you bring a riding buddy.'




