

After a short deliberation on the route to be followed, we set off at around 9.30 a.m. towards Goulburn, first donning rain gear. Bob, Dave and I soon lost sight of the others, but Bill caught up to us in Goulburn, where we stopped for coffee after "the rain", which I am now firmly convinced, is either a daily event in Goulburn, or is turned on specifically as a "welcome" to unwary motorcyclists.

Just prior to our departure from Goulburn, a fellow motorcyclist informed us that he had seen the Hahn Trio back along the road and (guess what?) the 250 was playing homesick, in usual style. Once again, the Hahns had to abort their trip and we were down to three motorcycles as we set out for Bundanoon, where we stopped to do some sight-seeing. 


