## A FEW THOUGHTS ON SAFETY

RECENTLY OUR CLUB DISCUSSED ASPECTS OF ROAD SAFETY AND MOTORCYCLE RIDER TRAINING IN ORDER TO MAKE US ALL MORE SAFETY CONSCIOUS.

SO FAR THE RIDER TRAINING PART IS STILL IN THE PLANNING STAGES, WITH MIKE 'THE BIKE' HOUSTON DOING THE 'ROAD' SECTION AND BOB RUMSEY TAKING CARE OF DIRT ROAD RIDING. PERHAPS WE CAN USE THE JOURNAL TO IMPART SOME 'HELPFUL HINTS'.

THE IDEA FOR THIS ITEM WAS BROUGHT ON BY A COMMENT IN THE LOCAL 4 OWNERS' MCC JOURNAL. THEIR CLUB CAPTAIN (EQUIVALENT TO OUR TOURING SECRETARY) HAD MENTIONED THAT SEVERAL RIDERS IN THEIR CLUB HAD BEEN INVOLVED IN A NUMBER OF ACCIDENTS AND HE SOUGHT TO HIGHTEN THEIR MOTORCYCLE SAFETY AWARENESS.

FIRSTLY, WE SHOULD ALL CONSIDER THE ROADWORTHINESS OF OUR BIKES (AND CARS TOO FOR THAT MATTER). CHECK REGULARLY ITEMS SUCH AS TYRES FOR WEAR AND CORRECT PRESSURE, LIGHTS - INCLUDING BRAKE AND INDICATOR BULBS - TO CHECK THAT THEY ARE ALL WORKING AND THAT SPARES ARE AVAILABLE AT HOME IF NOT STORED ON THE BIKE (IN THE TAILLIGHT ASSEMBLY IS A GOOD SPOT). WE ALL KNOW THAT A BULB WILL ONLY 'BLOW' AFTER THE SHOPS ARE SHUT... THE FRONT AND REAR BRAKES SHOULD BE CHECKED FOR ADJUSTEMENT AND TO ENSURE THAT PADS AND/OR SHOES ARE NOT WORN OUT. THE BRAKE FLUID SHOULD BE UP TO THE CORRECT LEVEL AND NOT TOO OLD, AS THE FLUID CAN ABSORB MOISTURE THAT AFFECTS THE BOILING POINT UNDER HARD BRAKING. THIS SHOULD BE CHANGED ACCORDING TO THE OWNER'S MANUAL RECOMMENDATIONS.

THE MOTOR CAN BE CHECKED FOR OIL LEVEL/LEAKS AND OVERALL
PERFORMANCE - CLUTCH ACTION ETC. - AND THE FRAME CHECKED FOR
CRACKS/FRACTURES THAT MAY OCCUR AFTER LONG TOURING TRIPS/ROUGH DIRT
ROADS AND SO ON. COPIES OF PREVIOUS TECHNICAL ARTICLES FROM EARLIER
JOURNALS COVERING THESE ITEMS CAN BE OBTAINED FROM FRANK MILLWOOD,
THE CLUB LIBRARIAN.

IT IS SO EASY TO TAKE THE BIKE'S CONDITION FOR GRANTED, AND THE DANGER HERE IS THAT WHEN AN EMERGENCY SITUATION OCCURS THAT'S THE TIME ANY FAULT COULD MEAN THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN A CLOSE SHAVE AND A NASTY ACCIDENT - AND THAT IS WHAT WE WANT TO AVOID.

THE NEXT THING TO CONSIDER IS OUR 'DRESS'. NO, I DON'T MEAN LIKE THE WOMEN IN THE CLUB WEAR, RATHER THE ITEMS WE SHOULD ALL WEAR AS SAFETY EQUIPEMENT, I.E. HELMET (CLEAN SCRATCH FREE VISOR ?), GLOVES, JACKET, STURDY SHOES OR BOOTS (NONE OF THIS THONGS AND SHORTS PLEASE, EVEN IF IT'S JUST A TRIP TO THE CORNER STORE...

THATS THE MOST LIKELY RECIPE FOR DISASTER, AS THE CASUALTY WARD AT MOST HOSPITALS WOULD ATTEST TO). I AGREE, IT'S NOT ALWAYS POSSIBLE OR ADVISABLE TO PUT ON A FULL SET OF LEATHERS FOR DAILY COMMUTING OR SHORT TRIPS, BUT COMMON SENSE SHOULD PREVAIL OVER UNSAFE CLOTHING STYLES WHEN RIDING IF YOU VALUE YOUR SKIN (LITERALLY). YOUR PROTECTIVE CLOTHING SHOULD BE IN GOOD ORDER AND SUITABLE FOR THE RIDING YOU INTEND TO DO. A LIGHTWEIGHT JACKET MIGHT BE FINE AROUND TOWN BUT NEXT TO USELESS ON A FOUR HOUR RIDE AFTER DARK...

HOW ABOUT YOUR RIDING 'ATTITUDE' ?? DO YOU CONSIDER OTHER ROAD USERS AS WELL AS YOUR PASSENGER'S SAFETY ?? LIKE OVERTAKING OVER DOUBLE YELLOW LINES - EVEN IF IT LOOKS SAFE, IT MAY CAUSE A CAR DRIVER SOME CONCERN AND MAKE HIS ATTITUDE TO RIDERS WORSE. SOMETIMES IT IS WORTHWHILE TO OVERTAKE/PASS AFTER A SHORT WAIT BEHIND A VEHICLE RATHER THAN TO JUST BLAST PAST REGARDLESS AS SOON AS YOU CATCH UP.

YOUR ATTITUDE BECOMES IMPORTANT AS SOON AS YOU CLIMB ABOARD THE BIKE AND START-UP. THE WAY YOU RIDE WILL ENHANCE YOUR CHANCE OF SURVIVAL ON THE ROAD. IF YOU EXPECT THE WORST FROM OTHER ROAD USERS, BE THEY TRUCK DRIVERS WITH A HEAVY RIG, OR A WOMAN IN A DATSUN CONCENTRATING ON THE KIDS PLAYING UP ON THE BACK SEAT INSTEAD OF YOU ABOUT TO CROSS IN FRONT OF HER AT AN INTERSECTION, THEN WHEN THE INEVITABLE '' I DIDN'T SEE YOU'' SITUATION OCCURS, YOU ARE ALL PREPARED FOR EVASIVE ACTION.

WHAT YOU NEED IS YOUR WITS ABOUT YOU AND AT THE SAME TIME CONSIDERATION FOR OTHER MOTORISTS (SO AS NOT TO DELIBERATELY ANTAGONISE THEM TO THE POINT WHERE THEY WANT TO RUN OVER THE NEXT BIKE THEY SEE...), AS YOUR SAFETY IS VERY OFTEN DEPENDENT ON THE ACTIONS OF OTHERS, ESPECIALLY IN HEAVY TRAFFIC WHEN A CAR CLOSE BEHIND COULD RUN INTO YOU IF YOU HAVE TO BRAKE SUDDENLY.

IT IS THEREFORE IMPORTANT TO CREATE YOUR 'ZONE OF SAFETY' ABOUT YOU AND THAT MAY MEAN LETTING SOMEONE PAST IF THEY DON'T KEEP A SAFE DISTANCE BEHIND.

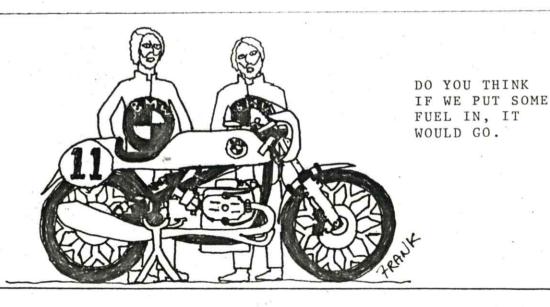
THE 'TWO SECOND RULE' IS ALSO HELPFUL. THAT IS, KEEPING AT LEAST
TWO SECONDS AWAY FROM THE CAR/BIKE IN FRONT. WHEN THEY PASS A
FIXED OBJECT - SAY A GUIDE POST - YOU COUNT ''ONE THOUSAND,
TWO THOUSAND'', AND IF YOU PASS THE SAME MARK BEFORE YOU FINISH,
THEN YOU ARE TOO CLOSE TO TAKE EVASIVE ACTION IF THEY SHOULD DO
SOMETHING UNEXPECTED (MAKE IT THREE SECONDS IF IT IS WET). A SIMPLE
MATTER TO BE SURE, BUT PART OF THE GOOD ATTITUDE WE SPOKE OF EARLIER.

THEN WE SHOULD IMPROVE OUR ROAD SKILLS. FIND A LARGE CAR PARK OR CLEAR ROAD AND PRACTISE CONTROLLED EMERGENCY BRAKING AND BIKE CONTROL BY SETTING UP A ROW OF WITCH'S HATS (EMPTY MILK CARTONS WITH A LITTLE WATER IN THEM WILL DO) AND SETTING A COURSE THROUGH THEM. IT IS BEST TO HAVE SOMEONE ELSE WITH YOU TO OBSERVE/MARK YOUR IMPROVEMENT AND IN CASE YOU NEED ASSISTANCE.

PERHAPS OTHERS CAN CONTRIBUTE TO THE JOURNAL ON THIS MATTER, SHARING THE 'NEAR MISS' EVENTS THAT HAVE OCCURED THAT COULD WARN OTHER RIDERS OR PERHAPS JUST TO RAISE QUESTIONS THAT SOMEONE COULD RESEARCH ANSWERS TO ON GENERAL MATTERS OF ROAD SAFETY. WE ARE ALWAYS LEARNING WHEN WE RIDE, AND ONE MISTAKE CAN BE OUR LAST.

LET'S HELP EACH OTHER ON THIS ONE BY LEARNING TO RIDE SAFELY AND ENCOURAGING OTHERS TO RIDE SAFELY AS WELL.

# THE R68

The R68 was made from 1952 'til 1954 in which some 1,453 examples were built, it was BMWs first 100mph road bike.

The motor , a type 268/1 was a flat twin four stroke with overhead valves, it had a capacity of 590 cm3 with a bore and stroke of 72 & 73mm, with a compression ratio of 7.6 to 1 and gave out 35 BHP at 7,000 RPM. It was fitted with two semi down draught Bing 26mm carburettors. There was a single disc dry plate clutch which fed power straight to a type 250/5 constant mesh four speed gearbox with gear ratio of 4.0 to 1 for 1st, 2.28 to 1 for 2nd, 1.7 to 1 for 3rd and 1.3 to 1 for 4th. A drive shaft with spiral bevel gear flexible disc hardy and universal joint gave power to the back wheel with a final drive ratio of 3.89 to 1.

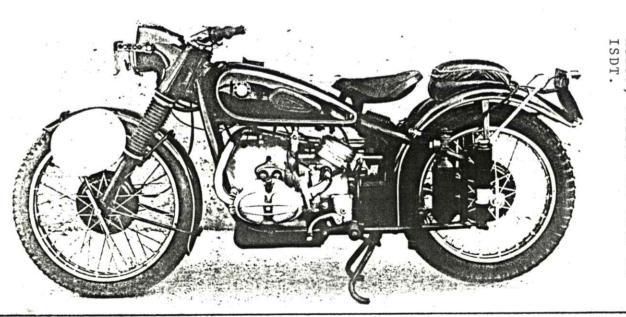
The frame was a type 251/4, a closed triangle twin-loop made out of oval section tubing. Fitted with telescopic forks with hyrdraulic shock absorber and helical compression springs up front with telescope plunger with helical compression springs at the rear. The wheels were 19 inch with twin leading shoe brakes at the front and single leading shoe at the rear.

The R68 was 2150mm long, a height of 725mm, a width of 790mm and a weight of 193kg unladen. It had a top speed of 160km/h and a fuel consumption of 21 km/l with a 17 litre fuel tank, it had a range of 357 km.

The R68 was BMWs sports model at the time and was different from other models, in that it had a change to the air filter housing and cleaner rocker covers with simpler lines, the mudguards were more sporting than usual on a BMW and it was fitted with a linked saddle and pillion seat which was a fore runner to the dual seat. In 1954 the forks were improved with two way hydraulic damping and lost their upper spring covers which were replaced with rubber gaiters. They were also fitted with full width light alloy hubs, straight spokes and alloy rims.

In 1953 Hans Roth and Georg Meier rode the R68 in the ISDT (International Six Day Trials) to win a gold which to my knowledge was the best off road performance, in road racing Jock Forrest won the 1954 Mount Druitt 24 hour for production machines, there were only two races held at Mount Druitt which is in the Sydney's Western suburbs . It is sad to note that Jocks two co riders were killed in the second race.
