

2009 WORLD SUPERBIKES AT PHILLIP ISLAND

With BMW returning to road racing at the first round of the 2009 World Superbikes at Phillip Island I just had to be there. So a leave pass was procured and arrangements put in place and at 08:30 on 26 February myself and my mate Doug (Suzuki DL650) departed from Red Rooster in Quean-beyan for the journey south. Doug was keen to get some dirt under his wheels so we headed out through Captains Flat and onto the dirt through Jerangle to Bredbo. This stretch of road was quite loose in places and ensured that we were paying attention. Also it was a bit chilly during the morning and with only summer gloves on the heated grips were put to good use. I must admit that it was a good feeling to be out on the dirt onboard the GS.



After making it to Bredbo we just stayed on the tar to our refuel at Jindabyne. Also fuelling up at the same time was a pair of immaculate KTM 990's and a Ducati Multistrada. I don't think that any of these bikes had ever seen any dirt roads as they were way too clean as were the matching BMW riding suits......anyway after Jindabyne it was back onto the dirt as we headed down the Barry Way.

Now I have heard many reports about the condition of the Barry Way and we must have struck it lucky as the road was in very good condition. We took our time and had a short stop at the Wallace Craigie lookout where the view is spectacular but there isn't much time to enjoy the views when riding as any slip up could see us and our bikes heading down a long, long way. We had our lunch stop at the site of the Cold Flame Rally at the junction of the Pinch and Snowy Rivers which was a good rest point.

The day was warming up as we continued south. I was following Doug as he could then decide when to stop and also see the errant 4wheel drives which happened to think that they are the only people on the road. We crossed into Victoria and made our way pass Suggan Buggan and Seldom Seen.

At the end of the dirt we came out onto a plateau and some of the best tar road I have ridden in a long time as we made out way into Buchan. This stretch of road is one that **must** be ridden again.

We stopped for a breather and a cold drink at Buchan before making our way to Bruthen and then onto the highway at Bairnsdale. Now after being out in the middle of nowhere for most of the day the increased traffic was unpleasant to say the least. Not far out of Bairnsdale we turned off the highway and take the Bengworden Road which is a good alternative to staying on the over policed highway. We refuelled at Stratford and headed to Maffra where we me up with friends of Doug's and stayed the night at the Macalister Hotel. The pub was clean and cheap and our arrival coincided with happy hour so after a couple of cleansing ales we secured the bikes (8) in the garage and enjoyed a nice dinner before turning in early after a long day on the bike.

RIDE REPORT CONT'D



Friday saw us on the road around 9ish. At the start we stayed on the back roads through Heyfield to Morwell and then the usual route through Mirboo North to Leongatha. It was along the Strezlecki Highway heading to Mirboo North where you could see the effect of the recent bushfires. In some cases the fire seems to have made it to the front door and it was easy to understand how nervous the locals must have been. We then went to Korumburra, Archies Creek and dropped off the range to our lunch stop at Dalyston where I said my farewells to the group as I was keen to get to the Island. I was staying with some friends from Gundagai in an on-site van at the Cowes Caravan Park whilst Doug and his friends were camping at the track.

Upon arrival at the island I topped up the tank and headed down to the caravan park and was settling the bill when my mates rolled in on cue (couldn't have planned it better). The park was within walking distance of town and the facilities were clean so I would have no hesitation in recommending this place to anyone heading to Phillip Island.

On Saturday morning we caught the bus out to the track and took in the sights, sound and smells of the Superbikes. After a quick look at the expo I meandered around the track stopping to catch the action at various points.

One of the attractions of the Supers over the Moto GP is that you can ride your bike into the circuit instead of leaving it off site so I spent most of the day walking around the track checking out the bikes that had been ridden there. Of course there were a heap of Ducati's but it was good see a fair smattering of BMW machinery of all shapes and sizes there too. The F800GS seemed to be very popular.

The new Superpole session was watched from the hill near turn 12. After that it was back onto the bus and into the Phillip Island RSL Club for a great meal before walking downtown to check out what bikes were around.

Sunday dawned overcast and a bit cool with rain threatening. We again caught the bus to the track and after more bike gawking caught the 1st Superbike race from the hill down near the start of Siberia. I saw the banner for the BMW Touring Club of NSW at the top of the hill. This is a great spot as you get to clearly see the bikes as they come out of Honda hairpin before heading through Siberia to the Hayshed and there was a huge superscreen located there to catch the action from the other areas of the track. A very good effort by Troy Corser to make it up to 8th place as well as having the fastest lap of the race.

We then caught the insane action of the Supersports from Lukey Heights and it was great to see the Aussies battling for the win. I then wandered around to the main straight and watched the 2nd Superbike race from in front of the podium where you could certainly get the feeling of the speeds of these machines as they went rocketing down Gardner Straight. Not such a good race for the BMW team and I even found myself cheering for Max Biaggi....anyway after the race it was back on the bus and into town for tea and an early night.

Monday morning came around and after bidding farewell to the Gundagai boys I met up with Doug at San Remo and we started a journey home. We had a fuel stop at Mirboo North where I bumped into some riders I knew from the BMW Touring Club of NSW and then we basically re-traced our Friday route and had lunch in Bruthen.

After lunch we headed to Orbost for a refuel and then hit the Bonang Highway. You know that it is going to be a good ride when you see the sign that indicates curves ahead for 92 kms......there is less and less dirt on this road every time I ride it and you could easily ride any BMW machine on it with confidence in fact 3 of Doug's friends rode their bikes down the Bonang on the way to Maffra (1 x Triumph Sprint ST, 2 x Aprilia RSV all loaded with camping gear).

We pushed on through Delegate and Bombala for our final stop for fuel and a stretch at Cooma. After Cooma we droned down the Monaro Highway and I took the turn off to the Old Cooma Road and made it home at about 5:40 pm.

As we had made a decision to stay off the highway for our return journey it was interesting to see the same group of Canberra based riders on the road near Morwell and at our stops in Bruthen and Cooma. It just goes to show that the road less travelled doesn't mean that it will be a longer day in the saddle.

Highlights:

- → The tar run into Buchan from the Victorian end of the Barry Way.
- → The relaxed feel of the entire event on the Island as well as out at the track when compared to attending the Moto GP.

Thursday night at the Macalister Hotel and just being out on the road for a decent ride.

Lowlights:

- → Some inappropriate behaviour by some riders on the way home.
- → Lack of BMW support/access to the general admission ticketholders. Not everyone wants to spend big bucks to sit on Gardner Straight when the best viewing is elsewhere around the circuit. I also thought that they could have had a presence in the expo and used the opportunity enable punters to try out their full range of clothing and accessories and maybe they could have sold some of their old stock. Not being able to watch the rugby at the RSL club (which wasn't too bad as the Brumbies lost anyway).

NEW RULES FOR TJ'S COMPETITION

In order to encourage more members to participate in the TJ's competition, it has been decided to change the criteria. There will be two competitions as below.

- Highest kilometres travelled irrespective of the number of bikes used.
- Closest to average kilometres travelled.
 Fxample

Rider One rides 2 bikes. He submits the kilometres on the 2 bikes and they count as one entry as he has done the kilometres. One has done 12,000 km and the other 9,000 km. So Rider One has done a total of 21,000 km but he has only one entry

Rider Two also has 2 bikes. 1 does 500 km and the other 18,000 km. - a total of 18,500 km. Rider Three has 3 bikes which the total kilometres add up to 34,000 km. This results in a total of 73,500 km which is divided by 3 entrants results and gives an average of 24,500 km.

So Rider One with 21,000 km is the closest and wins the prize.

It is accepted that not every member undertakes or wants to undertake extended bike journeys but nevertheless in the course of the year covers a high mileage in normal or less lengthy trips.

From 1st JUNE members who wish to enter the competition should submit the following:

Name, motorcycle, registration number and odometer reading as at 1st June to either: librarian1@actbmwmcc.org.au or editor1@actbmwmcc.org.au

(if you have more than one motorcycle, then the details and odometer reading for each bike should be submitted. These totals will be added together to make one entry.)

On 1st November you should submit the odometer readings* for all bikes nominated.

* This figure will be used as the starting point for the following year. (Reminders will given in the Newsletter).

The Club has a New Name! Now we Need a New Logo!

The purpose of this short article is to bring everyone up to date about what is happening now.

Firstly, I have advised the ACT Registrar General that we have changed our name, and hence our Constitution, by special resolution as set out in our Constitution. The new Constitution, with the new name, has been lodged with the Registrar General and as soon as we receive notification that they have accepted it we will be good to go to notify BMW Clubs Australia (and hence BMW Clubs International) of our name change.

The next big piece of work is to design our new logo. We already have clear guidelines about the overall design and layout of our Club logo but we need to design a new graphic that fits within that overall design.

Are you a Club member with creative abilities?

Do you have some great ideas about the future look of the Club's logo?

If you answered "yes!" to either of these questions then you might want to put pen to paper (or fingertips to keyboards) and develop a graphic for the new Club logo. There are no specific criteria set for the design features of the graphic:

It can be an abstract design

It can be a photo (provided it is a photo that we have permission to use)

It can be a symbol

It can be a drawing

You can use any colours that you wish

You won't need to include the BMW Roundel in your graphic, as that is already included in the overall design of the logo.

BMW CLUB AUSTRALIA

Annual Meeting of Delegates

The annual meeting of the BMW Clubs Delegates was held in Melbourne, Sunday April 26. This annual gathering is normally a 2 day event, but due to the current financial climate, this was streamlined to 1 day. With only 1 day available, the agenda was compact and efficiency was the order of the day with the delegates covering a range of topical points during the day. We were also lucky enough to have attending as an invitee Ian Bramston, Chairman of BMW Clubs International, who at the request of the forum provided an overview of the Clubs International scene.


Among the topics covered during the day included;

- Report on the Car Club Nationals 2009 held recently in the NSW Southern Highlands and the planning for the Car Clubs next national event scheduled for 2011.
- Discussions on the opportunity for a National Event for Bikes, which culminated in the suggestion that consideration be given to co hosting a National Event with a Safari Event, on the basis that the Safaris draw riders from all States. This is to be considered further and a recommendation presented back to the forum later in the year.
- Update on the BMW Corporate Image changes and resultant change to logos, communication protocols. Generally this is progressing well with some clubs well advanced on updating and freshening up their logos and other club merchandising. BMW Clubs Australia is able to provide a formatting service for all new logos and names once supplied by the Clubs. (This is free of charge). This will include final approval of Munich, and upon receipt of that approval issue of the updated formats issued back to the Club on CD for their use.
- Total Club Memberships for both cars and bikes is 4022 nationally with both bikes and cars reporting an increase in members from the previous year.

General business items such as Club levies (voted to remain at the current level), Customer complaints, communications with BMW Group Australia and the feedback on the WSBK event at Phillip Island and BMW Group Australia's presence there.


After lunch we were lucky to have Mr Toni Andreevski, BMW Group Australia provide an overview of the business in Australia, including focusing on new models scheduled for launch later this year in Australia. For bikes we have already seen the new K1300 models in the showrooms and we will see the new F800R arrive late this year. 

There were a number of developments over the life of this machine. The R67, as above and then the R 67/2 (1952/53) with a power output increased to 28kW. The 1954 model had an improved telescopic fork with full width hub brakes. There seems to be some discrepancy exactly the full width drum brakes were introduced. The last variant the R 67/3 (1955/1956) of this model was a special made for sidecars.

After much reading of the books and many hours on the net there are not many exciting details on this model. Mind you there are plenty of restored bikes to be seen in showroom condition and several for sale at around \$14000.00 Aus.

The only thing of note would be the covers on the front forks. It appears that inner and outer tubes had very little clearance and if not positioned correctly they would rub together and wear through. This would be exaggerated under breaking due to fork flex. This was rectified in the later models.






