# Karuah Twenty10 or a tale of 2 bikes

After the February 2009 Karuah River Rally hosted by the BMWTCNSW in some 400mm rain over 48 hours, I resolved to buy an off-roader rather than continuing to take my road sports tourer of the moment up and down dirt roads going to rallies.

June 2009 saw the family purchase a R100GSPD premised on (1) I could do most of the maintenance myself having previously owned a R100RS, (2) if the bike was tired and had a lie down on the dirt - we could live with some cosmetic damage, and (3) it would get me out of the house or keep me out of the house depending on your point of view.

The bike's previous owner had overhauled the bike's top-end, replaced the clutch and drive shaft and rebuilt the gearbox and final drive, so I looked forward to getting to know it safe that at least the mechanicals were in good order. Jane a Swans fan had now named the bike 'Barry (Hall)' as it was a bit ruff and tuff and we were getting on fine until it decided to stop at Uriarra Crossing having done the Tharwa road loop with a mate on his G650GS. Despite my best efforts and stripping the bike down in the car park, demonstrating both my prowess and the extensive BMW toolkit of yesteryear, it was a trailer job - not an auspicious start. More so when Jane (car & trailer) was having her hair done at a friend's hairdresser.

Having recovered the bike to home, a deeper analysis found that both ignition coil and ICU (black box) had died. Which went first or whether one caused the other to fail, I do not know. No problem, this is why I purchased an almost 20 year old bike...on the Internet.

Having brought the R100GS as much on reputation as actual ability, a quick search identified a host of original and 3<sup>rd</sup> party manufacturers and suppliers of OEM and aftermarket parts. This looks like fun, just do not look at the cc statement. My favourites to date are Moto-bins in the UK and Munich Motorcycles based in WA. At the risk of plugging, Moto-bins have been outstanding in service, price and delivery. Jane and the Toll guy are now on first name basis as if you are going to pay for shipping, you may as well fill up the box. Ask for a quote when you get to the bigger bits as the freight will discount the part's price saving.

# Karuah Twenty10 or a tale of 2 bikes

Having replaced both coil and ICU, Barry and I are now friends again as I have since replaced various cables, rubber seals and o-rings, the front brake hose with a SS one (great improver), overhauled the front forks and replaced the rear suspension with a new Ohlins (ouch) after the rebuilt WP failed un-expectedly. The upside is that the Ohlins makes an amazing difference to the bike's handling on dirt.

Since then and over summer, Barry and I have travelled the dirt around Canberra went to the 2009 Casper, Trout and Clubs Kosciuszko Rally as well as a few trips to the coast by dirt; all good stuff by ourselves, with Jane or Mitchell our middle son and aspiring rider.

So, it came to the second week in February and Karuah River 2010. Hmm, ~550 kilometres by the most direct route of Hume & F3 Highways or the more touristy back roads and avoid the highway. After a quick planning meeting, and check on the forecast rain, Jane and I opted for highway and overnight with friends in Sydney. True to form, the rain started on our arrival in Sydney and continued through the night.

Saturday awoke to showers and morning coffee, before taking the plunge (no pun) and leaving Sydney dodging the rain but not where it had been. From Gosford on the weather got increasingly hot rising to the mid 30C and high humidity, finishing with a final 10km dash to Dungog under very threatening skies. A massive downpour whilst we were standing on the footpath of the Bank Hotel called for socialising, lunch and ales with the some 40 other bikes and riders.

With lunch over and break in the weather we made our way to the Frying Pan Creek campsite (15km dirt), passing where the rain had been with only the occasional slip and slide to keep us aware. We made camp in hot, humid overcast conditions and completed before the occasional 'sun-shower' a theme for the afternoon and evening.

With more than 100 bikes and riders in attendance, the campsite was full and an evening of catching up and regaling ensued. Our rally raffle luck continued with Jane winning an Alpine 40th Rally shirt, just as well we went. An increasing number of car attendees or support vehicles (?) were the only spot on an otherwise great rally supported by BBQ and breakfast hosted by the NSW Club.

Sunday saw us and others make for an early start with a direct route home to Canberra planned. With at least 6 ACT bikes and riders in attendance, from varying locales, we may have had



the numbers for a club award with better planning; maybe next year.

Having ridden in on the bottom road and wet clay, we opted for the top road on the way out, this involves a fording achieved without difficulty, before a quick breakfast in Dungog and sprint home; one benefit of the highway. Others had planned to return by Oberon – a trip that would have been more than wet we suspect.

Our trip home was uneventful, thanks to Jane and her new BMW rain suit being more than a match for the torrential rain from Campbelltown to the Canberra turnoff and run through Canberra with the Majura Road closed to flooding.

And the bike...well the R1200ST handled the highway, mud, clay and rain fine, after all, the R100GSPD is now worth more than the 1200, so Garry can't possibly take it on the dirt!!!!

I then spent some time reflecting on my cornering and braking skills. The underlying theme, is always expect the unexpected in blind corners.

# TRANSIT LANES

Are you up to speed with the correct use of Canberra's T-lanes when riding your motorbike? The subject was discussed at the January club meeting and clarification was called for. Here it is (excerpt from the *ACT Motorcycle Riders' Handbook*, October 2009):



Motorcycle riders are allowed to use these lanes.

### BUS LANES



Motorcycle riders are allowed to use these lanes.

### BUS ONLY LANES



When the words BUSES ONLY appear on a BUS LANE sign, or lane markings indicate a BUS ONLY lane, only buses are allowed to drive in these lanes. Motorcycle riders are NOT allowed to use these lanes.

### T-WAY LANES - NSW RULE



These are special lanes which can only be used by authorised buses and service vehicles. Motorcycle riders are NOT allowed to use these lanes.

### BICYCLE LANES

Motorcycle riders are not allowed to use a bicycle lane, except for 50 metres when entering or leaving a road or to avoid an obstruction.

Over the life of this model there were several minor changes which included a boost in power a stronger crankshaft and a change in the taper on the front of the crankshaft where the armature of the generator was fitted. This machine made an excellent sidecar combination because of its excellent torque. It was used by many governments, armed forces and police all over the world. This included Australia particularly New South Wales. I remember seeing them in the late fifties in Sydney where I spent my younger days.

This photo seems to be one of the last or one fitted with handlebar indicators. These were a optional factory extra. Many owners had the air filter box chromed. This photo also shows it was probably for the American market as it has high handlebars as against the lower ones for the European market.


